What do girls earn by selling cookies?


In addition to learning life skills through the Girl Scout Cookie Program, girls can earn exciting individual and troop rewards like like themed items, camp, and troop experiences.

GSWNY utilizes results from our girl and member survey to select the current season's rewards.



Cookies are \$6 per package

- Troops earn a base proceeds of \$.90 per package
- Cadette, Senior, and Ambassador troops have the option to earn an additional \$0.13 per package by waiving recognitions
- If the troop's PGA is 350 pkgs, they'll earn an additional \$.05 per package
