Tuition Rewards Program

Girl Scouts Earn Points for College Scholarships

There is a very special benefit for Girls and Families who participate in our Recruitment & Retention program! Girl Scouts will receive Tuition Rewards Points each year, earning up to 2,500 points each membership year; both co-leaders can earn up to 3,500 points each membership year.

Tuition Rewards Points are similar to frequent flyer points. In this case, the points can be used for Tuition/Scholarship at almost 350 affiliated private colleges and universities across the US. There are 24 affiliated private colleges in New York State. Each point is equivalent to \$1 in guaranteed Tuition/Scholarship at the participating colleges and universities. For Example, Alfred University, St. Bonaventure, Canisius, Hilbert, Daemen, RIT, St. Lawrence, Roberts Wesleyan, and Duquesne. 2,500 POINTS TOTAL CAN BE EARNED BY GIRLS:

- The Girl registers by 12/1/16= 500 points
- The Girl adds a friend who registers by 12/1/16= 500 points
- The Girl earns 3 Awards: (1) Financial Literacy; (1) Community Service; (1) Legacy Badge= 1,000 points:

Financial Literacy – A Girl must earn one of the Core GSUSA Financial Literacy Badges. There is a Financial Literacy badge for a girl to earn each year she is a Girl Scout. (D-Money Counts Leaf, D-Making Choices Leaf, B-Money Manager Badge, B-Philanthropist Badge, J-Business Owner Badge, J-Savvy Shopper Badge, C-Budgeting Badge, C-Comparison Shopping Badge, C-Financing My Dreams Badge, S-Financing My Future Badge, S-Buying Power Badge, A-On My Own Badge and A-Good Credit Badge)

Community Service – A girl must take part in some form of Community Service for the Scout Year. There is the opportunity for a *Take Action Project* with each Journey a Girl Scout completes. Cadettes and older Girl Scouts can also earn the *Community Service Bar* or *Service to Girl Scouting Bar* for the corresponding Girl Scout Level. Juniors and older Girl Scouts may also work on Community Service while completing a *Higher Award* (Bronze, Silver and Gold.) A scout must put in a total of 10 hours of community service to earn this award. This can be done as a Troop, Girl Scout Event or on their own. The Community Service does not have to be part of a Girl Scout Earned Award.

Legacy Badge – A girl must earn one of the Core GSUSA Legacy Badges. For the Daisy level Girl Scout this includes the Promise Center, and any of the 10 petals. For the Brownie and Older Girl Scouts they can earn a badge from any one of the 9 Legacy Categories. (Artist, Athlete, Citizen, Cook, First Aid, Girl Scout Way, Naturalist, Girl Choice Outdoor, Girl Choice Art in the Outdoors.)

- The Girl re-registers during Spring Registration (2017-2018 membership year) = 500 points

3,500 POINTS TOTAL CAN BE EARNED BY BOTH CO-LEADERS:

- The troop registers by 12/1/16= 1,000 points
- The troop has the same number of girls registered as last year (9/30/16)= 1,000 points
- The troop size increases over last year (9/30/16) by 3/31/17 = 1,000 points
- New troop registers by 1/1/17= 3,000 points
- The troop re-registers 100% during Spring Registration (2017-2018 membership year) = 500 points
