This game illustrates the need for the girls to match their actions to your words. The scouts all stand in a line at one side of the room. The leader stands in front of them. The leader calls out an action, but does something else. For example, she may say, "Hop on one foot," while she does jumping jacks. The girls try to *follow the spoken direction and not the leader's action*.

Campfire Chili

1 to 1-1/2 pounds ground beef
1 medium onion, chopped
1 can Mexican flavored stewed tomatoes

1 can red kidney beans (or black beans)
1 can corn, drained
1-2 cans condensed tomato soup (to taste)
2 teaspoon chili powder
1 teaspoon cumin

Brown ground beef with onions. Add all other ingredients. Bring to a boil; then simmer for 10 minutes. (You may decide to bring cooked rice or pasta in a cooler. Serving the chili over either will warm it up.)



Caterpillar Race

Divide the group into two teams.

Have the first one in line bend down and place her hands on the ground. At least one hand must be touching the ground at all times during the race.

The rest of the players reach down and grab the ankles of the person in front of them.

Give them a signal to start. They must move together to come to some pre-determined end point.

The first team to have all of its players pass the end point (while still attached) wins.

Campurritos

16 Eggs
1 lb. Sausage
1 Yellow Onion
3 Cloves Garlic, minced
6 Med. Potatoes, chopped
2 Cups Cheddar Cheese, shredded
4 Green Onions, chopped
3 T. Parsley, chopped
8 or 9 Tortilla Shells
Salt & Pepper to taste
Tin Foil for wrapping
Optional: Salsa and/or hot sauce

Chop potatoes and boil until soft.

Chop green onions and set aside.

Crack 16 eggs and cook over low heat until you have soft, scrambled eggs.

Salt and pepper to taste. Saute yellow onions and garlic in 2 T. olive oil until fragrant.

Add sausage to onion mixture and cook all the way through.

In large bowl combine Sausage mixture, scrambled eggs, potatoes, cheese, green onions, parsley, and Salt & Pepper.

Divide ingredients into 8 or 9 tortilla shells. Roll and wrap in tin foil -- ready to throw on the fire!

No-sew T-shirt Tote Bag

Old t-shirt - the thicker the fabric, the sturdier the bag

Sharp scissors, preferably fabric scissors

Cut off the sleeves

Cut out the entire neckline.

If you haven't already turned your t-shirt inside out, do it now. (If you want the

fringe to show, do not turn the shirt inside out.)

Cut a slit on either side of the shirt. Cut slits from the bottom of the shirt up to the line marking the bottom of your bag. You'll want to cut both the front and back layers together because they need to match up for the next step. Cut the slits about one inch apart.

Tie knots along the bottom of the shirt holding pieces of the corresponding strips from either side. Tie 2 or 3 knots with each set of strips to make it secure.

If you want the fringe to show, you are done. Otherwise, turn the shirt inside out for no fringe
