Direct Sales March 5-April 2

By hosting a booth sale, girls get experience conducting transactions, new answering questions, counting money, setting up product displays, and managing inventory.

- Council-Secured booths are arranged by Girl Scouts of WNY staff with our corporate and community partners. The sign-up process is in two phases for these booths: Lottery and first-come, firstserved (FCFS). Instructions on how to enter the lottery and FCFS will be sent to you in January.
- Troop-Secured booths are arranged by troops at local businesses in their communities. Have your troop contact local businesses, as it is a great way for girls to learn business strategy and people skills. Troops can start NOW to set up locations for their troops! Think outside the cookie box... hold a Drive-Thru or Virtual Booth!
- Organize a Community SU drive-thru event; help troops secure booth locations
- Remind troops to enter troop booth sale locations in SC under troop-secured booths. This will allow council to promote the sale and give the troop ability to use credit cards as payment by their customers. (Download the Smart Cookies app to use credit card function.) GSWNY is again participating in a program to subsidize shipping rates for Smart Cookies Direct Ship. ABC Bakers is now

requiring a 9 package minimum before the discount applies. The consumer will see a message at the point-of-sale indicating the lower shipping cost.

Before the Program

Service unit Product Program (SUPPM) are required to hold an informational meeting with troop leaders and troop cookie chairs to go over the details of this year's cookie program. This should be held in December or early January, preferably in a virtual setting. Remember, troops must have their materials early enough in order to meet with their girls and parents.





Online Order Taking December 10-April 2

The Smart Cookies platform allows girls, councils, and volunteers to seamlessly manage every aspect of the cookie business from a smartphone, tablet, or computer. Sign in daily to monitor progress, connect with the community, and find helpful resources to support success. Smart Cookies consolidates everything you need to a single platform, allowing you to seamlessly submit and manage orders, set up booth locations, track finances, and simplify your workflow.

Getting Started: If you are a returning SUPPM, you are already in the system and can use last year's credentials. If you are new to the position, an email with a registration link will be sent directly to you from noreply@abcsmartcookies.com. Once you are registered, you will receive a confirmation email that contains your username and password. Note: Please make sure to add abcsmartcookies.com to your safe senders list.

Each year, we clear out the system of troops and girls - hey are uploaded in November from our membership system. All troop volunteers and girls must be a registered and background checked Girl Scout to participate in the cookie program. Troop leaders will receive their link to register in Smart Cookies on

DEC. 10- APRIL 2: ONLINE PROGRAM IS OPEN

- Safety is our top priority. Before participating in any money-earning GS activities, it is important girls and adults review and sign the Girl Scout Online Safety Pledge, and Practical Tips for Parents, Safety tips for Product Sales, Digital Cookie Girl Pledge
- By opening the online program early, it allows girls time to set up their dashboard, send emails, texts, and share their link via social media.
- Parents must approve all orders within 5 days taken via the Girl Delivery Link or QR code. These cookie orders must be given to the troop leader to fulfill for the customer.
