



The President's Volunteer Service Award

(For Girls and Adult Volunteers)

Both Girl Scouts and America have long and proud traditions of volunteer service. Presidential recognition is a tremendous honor that sets you apart from your peers. Even though you may not seek recognition, your example can deliver a powerful message that encourages others to take action.

The President's Volunteer Service Award recognizes United States citizens and lawfully admitted, permanent residents of the United States who have achieved the required number of hours of service over a 12-month time period or cumulative hours over the course of a lifetime. **Girl Scouts of Western New York (GSWNY) may certify volunteer hours completed as a result of Girl Scout service only.**

Award Levels

There are four levels of the President's Volunteer Service Award:

- Bronze Level
- Silver Level
- Gold Level
- Lifetime Achievement Award

The number of volunteer hours required over a 12-month period for different age groups:

	Kids (ages 5-10)	Teens (ages 11-15)	Young Adults (ages 16-25)	Adults (ages 26+)
Bronze	26-49	50-74	100-174	100-249
Silver	50-74	75-99	175-249	250-499
Gold	75+	100+	250+	500+
Lifetime	Individuals who have completed 4,000 or more hours in their lifetime*			

*Volunteers may reuse hours utilized for annual awards toward a future Lifetime Achievement Award.

Awards

Upon completion of service, eligible participants can request*:

- President's Volunteer Service Award Package including:
 - A personalized certificate of achievement
 - A congratulatory letter from the President of the United States
 - President's Volunteer Service Award Pin for the level achieved – Bronze, Silver, Gold or Lifetime

* Items are ordered using the *President's Volunteer Service Award Certification form*.



The President's Volunteer Service Award



Record of Service

To earn an award, individuals must keep a record of volunteer activities and hours served.

To do this, you must:

- Keep a record of service hours completed as a Girl Scout member. GSWNY cannot certify volunteer hours performed outside of Girl Scout activities. Use the **President's Volunteer Service Award Record of Service Hours** (page 5) to record.
- Because GSWNY submits our annual order for awards in October, the 12-month period for Bronze, Silver, or Gold level certifying service is October 1 – September 30, which also follows the Girl Scout year.
- For those who wish to request the Lifetime Achievement Award and need assistance in calculating hours, use the “Suggested Guidelines for Service Hours.”

Requesting Awards

When you have completed the required number of hours for the desired award level, submit the **President's Volunteer Service Award Certification Form** (page 4).

- For those requesting a Lifetime Achievement Award, you must certify that you are: (1) United States citizen or lawful permanent resident (by providing documentation), and (2) are not a registered sex offender listed on the National Sex Offender Registry (by submitting to a background check). We will contact you to verify these requirements.

Ordering and Delivery of Awards

A council-wide order is placed once per year in October; please plan accordingly. Application and record of service must be received by October 15th. Delivery of awards varies and is dependent on processing by PVSA administration.

The President's Volunteer Service Award



Record of Service Hours instructions:

- **Girl Scouts of Western New York may certify volunteer hours completed as a Girl Scout member only.** These can be hours done as a Girl Scout volunteer or girl member in service to other organizations, but cannot be service done as a private individual, family, or as part of volunteering through another organization (such as church or school).
- Girl hours can include service done with a troop or as an Individually Registered Girl, and may include hours toward earning Girl Scout Higher Awards such as the Bronze, Silver, or Gold Award.
- Volunteer hours may include hours that are also recognized with GSUSA or GSWNY adult recognitions.
- When calculating your hours, include planning, travel and execution time.

Examples for Bronze, Silver, or Gold requests:

For volunteer roles, you do not need to list every individual service hour earned, but may group your hours by month or activity.

Examples for Lifetime Achievement Award Requests:

Since most volunteers have not been recording their hours over many years, you may use the suggested service hour ranges below. The range is based on an average number of service hours; you may have served more hours. Your hours should be based on your best estimate.

Position	Range of service hours
Troop Co-Leader	150-250
Service Unit Manager	120-200
Service Unit Team member (treasurer, cookie manager, etc)	25-75
Troop Cookie Manager	10-30
Service Unit Camp Out (SUCO) Director	75-100
National Delegate	125-175
Girl Scout Trainer	50-150
Council Committee Member	25-75
