## About the ..... *Juliette Program*

The Juliette program is Girl Scouting custom-made for you! It's a great way to mix and match your unique interests with Girl Scout participation – special events, weekend workshops, leadership projects, or travel opportunities that improve your skills and meet your interests and needs.

Girl Scout Juliettes are busy, independent, self-confident girls and young women who want to be a part of something larger – Girl Scouts! Meeting in troops is one way to be a part of the Girl Scout experience, but when there aren't available troops in your area, your troop no longer meets, or you become too busy with extracurricular activities or sports, becoming a Juliette will allow you to continue your Girl Scout experience on an individual basis.

The Juliette program is available to all girls in Kindergarten through 12th grade. It is especially popular for girls ages 11-17 who love the Girl Scout

program but are very busy with other activities.

As a Girl Scout Juliette, you can participate in everything that is open to your grade level. You can attend Council-sponsored programs such as events, year-round camp experiences, and travel opportunities. You can also take part in Council-sponsored money earning activities to help pay for Girl Scout events.

As a Juliette, you will work on Girl Scout programs with a parent or another adult mentor. You will decide what activities to participate in and which earned recognitions awards you wish to complete. Girl Scout Juliettes can earn the Journey awards and badges as well as the Girl Scout Bronze, Silver, and Gold Awards.

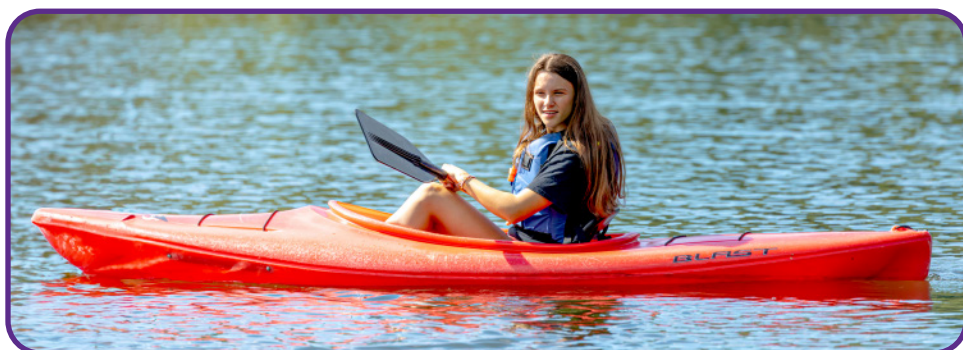
Seniors

# Girl Scout Leadership Experience



## Financial *assistance*

Financial Assistance is available to girls to supplement the cost of membership dues. Girl Scout Juliettes can also apply for financial assistance which helps offset fees for Council-sponsored events including travel and summer camp opportunities. ## Membership *dues*

Girl Scouts of the USA (GSUSA), our national organization, requires a \$25 nonrefundable annual fee to register as a girl or adult member. This payment goes directly to GSUSA headquarters in New York to provide program development and Council support services. Registered members are covered by GSUSA's accident insurance when participating in Girl Scout activities. Parents/caregivers, guardians, and other adults are also invited to become members of the Girl Scout movement.

# Product *Program*

Girl Scouts of Western New York offers two annual product programs; our Magazines & Munchies Fall Product Sale and our Cookie Program. Girl Scout Juliettes can participate in both programs and earn exciting rewards, as well as Service Unit funds to support their Girl Scout activities.

During the Fall and Cookie Programs, proceeds earned by all participating Juliettes within the Service Unit are held by the Service Unit Team. You may contact the Service Unit Team when you are ready to participate in a GSWNY activity, Council sponsored trip, attend an event, or are working on your Girl Scout Bronze, Silver, or Gold Award.

Product programs support activities, and they help to support the overall operation of each local Girl Scout Council. Properties, equipment, adult training, program activities, insurance, and administrative support to volunteers are all important parts of the Girl Scout program and are funded in part by the product programs.

Girl Scout Juliettes have a variety of ways to participate in Product Program such as participating independently, with other Juliette Girl Scouts in the Service Unit, or with another sister troop within your Service Unit.

To participate in Product Program, they must have a current GSUSA membership, along with a signed GSWNY Fall Parent/Caregiver Permission form/GSWNY Cookie Parent/Caregiver Permission Form they wish to participate in.

## 5 Skills for Girl Scouts

*The Girl Scout Product Programs teach girls about goal setting, decision making, money management, people skills and business ethics.*

We welcome and encourage Juliettes to participate in the Council's annual Fall Magazines & Munchies and Spring Cookie Sale programs. The Juliette must be a registered Girl Scout for the current membership year and her finances must be managed by a member of the local Service Unit Team such as the Service Unit finance consultant.

- The Girl Scout Juliette's parent/caregiver will need to notify the Service Unit Cookie Manager for participation in the Cookie Sale Program as an independent Girl Scout. The Service Unit Cookie Manager will provide training, materials and program information to the Juliette and her parents.

### **How it works:**

At the end of each sale the Juliette will give their order card and online orders to the registered adult managing the sale.

- Their order will be processed and the adult managing the sale will pick up and distribute her order to the Girl Scout or parents/caregivers. The Girl Scout will pay the adult managing the sale the full value of the product.
- Girls will earn recognitions and patches that will be picked up from the Service Unit adult.
- Booth sales are troop activities. IRGs can partner with a troop to attend a booth sale. IRGs can hold a Lemonade stand in their yard, lemonade stands cannot be entered into Smart Cookies as a booth because they are at private residences.

- The proceeds stay within the Service Unit treasury. When the Juliette needs funds she requests the funds from the Service Unit. These proceeds can be used for GSWNY sponsored programs, events, or trips, GSUSA destinations, items from the Girl Scout Shops, GSWNY camp fees, Take Action projects, and Service Unit events.
- The funds should be used during the program year but with permission, the Juliette, with Service Unit approval, can save for a long term goal such as a GSUSA destination trip.

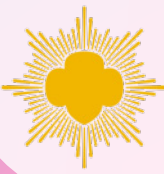

## Girl Scouting's *Highest* AWARDS

**The Bronze Award** recognizes that a Girl Scout Junior has gained the leadership and planning skills required to follow through with a project that makes a positive difference in her community. They earn the Bronze Award by completing a Junior Journey, and then creating a Take Action project based on their observations of a local issue. As the girls pursue their project, they put the Girl Scout Promise and Law into action. They also develop an understanding of sustainability and gain an understanding of the wider world by discussing how others may experience the same problem that their project helped resolve. After a Girl Scout completes a Junior Journey, the suggested minimum time commitment is 20 hours for each girl to build their team, explore their community, choose and plan their project, put their plan in motion, and spread the word to educate and inspire others.

**The Silver Award** symbolizes a Girl Scout Cadette's accomplishments in Girl Scouting and community activities as she matures and works to better her life and the lives of others. To earn this award, a Girl Scout needs to complete a Cadette Journey and create a Take Action project that improves their neighborhood or local community. After girls complete the Cadette Journey, the suggested minimum time for earning their Girl Scout Silver Award is 50 hours. They earn the award by focusing on

an issue they care about; building a team; exploring their community; picking, planning, and putting their Take Action project into action; demonstrating an understanding of sustainability and the wider world; and sharing what they have learned with others.

**The Gold Award**, the highest award in Girl Scouts, focuses on Senior and Ambassador's interests and personal journey through leadership skills and service. Fulfilling the requirements for the Girl Scout Gold Award starts with completing two Senior or Ambassador Journeys, or having earned the Silver Award and completing one Senior or Ambassador Journey. Each Journey you complete gives you the skills you need to plan and implement your Take Action project. After you have fulfilled the Journeys requirement, 80 hours is the suggested minimum to take the steps necessary to achieve your goal.

This prestigious award is definitely a plus when applying to colleges and financial scholarships. A Girl Scout who has earned her Gold Award automatically rises one rank in any of the U.S. military branches.

## *Get Out & Camp*

Girl Scouts of Western New York offers various types of organized camping opportunities: day camp, summer resident camp, and troop camp. We operate three beautiful resident camps which offer a wide variety of programs:

- **CAMP SEVEN HILLS**

Camp Seven Hills is located in Holland, NY and encompasses approximately 620 acres of woodland paths, sunny meadows, streams, hills and ponds suitable for water activities.

- **CAMP WINDY MEADOWS**

Camp Windy Meadows is less than 25 miles from the splendor of Niagara Falls, Camp Windy Meadows, located in Cambria, NY, offers a rustic setting containing 39 acres of trails, meadows, program areas, forest and campsites and facilities.



- **CAMP PIPERWOOD**

Located on 66 acres in Fairport, NY, Camp Piperwood hosts a winterized building with two lodges, a pavilion with picnic space, and a multi-function Splash Pad that can serve 75 campers during the warm seasons.

- **CAMP TIMBERCREST**

Camp Timbercrest is located on more than 900 acres of the Allegany Forest in Randolph, NY, offering hiking trails, tranquil scenery and a beautiful 31 acres lake perfect for aquatic activities.

#### *As a parent/caregiver, you:*

- Sign the girl membership form and pay the annual \$25 national membership dues. This membership fee provides insurance coverage when she is involved in Girl Scout activities.
- Sign parent/caregiver permission slips for events, and make sure any necessary forms (health history, etc.) are turned in.

- See that your daughter arrives and is picked up on time for Girl Scout activities.
- Provide funds for special events and activities or request financial assistance from the Council.
- Support your daughter's commitment to the Girl Scout Juliette program.
- Help your daughter participate in Girl Scout Product Programs by following safety guidelines and helping her check over her orders.
