What is a Cookie Rally?

A Girl Scout Cookie Rally is an ideal kickoff event to generate excitement in troops, Girl Scouts, and their families for Girl Scout Cookie season!

A rally is a great place Girl Scouts and Volunteers establish connections with other troops in their service unit while working through the station activities centered on developing entrepreneurship skills.

We created this guide to make it easy for our Service Units to host this event. Included are easy-to-follow instructions and activities.

Getting Started:

Create a Budget

A. Go through this kit with your team and decide which activities you would like to include in your rally.

B. Make a list of additional supplies you may need.

Find a Location

Look for a space with enough room to host your stations, allow families a place to sample the cookies, and have a quiet area for training. Here's some ideas:

A. Partner Event: Combine your rally with a fun family activity. Reserve space at a roller skating rink, local park, or even the zoo!

B. Community Center: Check out your local community centers. It's more than likely they would love to support our local Girl Scouts and host the fun event, while providing plenty of room to set up station activities like ones you will find in this rally kit.

3 Advertise

Advertising your SU Cookie Rally is a great way to spread the word and excite Girl Scouts! Below are some ideas to get you started:

- 1. Service Unit Newsletters + marketing emails/flyers
- 2. Service Unit Social Media
- 3. Include a pre-registration option so you can adequately prepare! There are lots of free sites, such as Sign Up Genius or Google Forms that make it easy to create a sign up form to share.
- Recruit Volunteers

Don't try to do it all alone. Break jobs into small responsibilities that volunteers can easily do. Invite Cadette/ Senior/Ambassador Girl Scouts to help with set up and program activities.

6 Create a Plan

Create an agenda/timeline to keep on track. Stations in this guide are designed to take 15 minutes each. We've included instructions to help guide you and your volunteers for the activity.

Remember to plan extra time for younger girls who may need help cutting out certain activities.



Go Extra!

On each station's instruction page, look for the GO EXTRA BOX for ideas on extra stations or activities. Note, Go Extra supplies are provided by the service unit and not included in this kit.

Recruit Help from Cadettes/ Seniors/ Ambassadors

Older Girl Scouts are great volunteers for Cookie Rally activities. Bonus! This counts towards their volunteer hours.

Troop Leader Training

The Cookie Rally is a great way to get your troop Cookie Volunteers trained!

We recommend holding this meeting in a separate room or corner away from from the event and about halfway through, so leaders have a chance to enjoy the event first with their Girl Scouts.

The following meeting agenda is a suggested guide. Service Units can modify it as they see fit for their Cookie Volunteers.

Instructions

- 1. Make this announcement about 10 minutes before the meeting time:
- "Our Volunteer Cookie Training will begin in (insert location) in 10 minutes. Please finish up and start making your way back here. Families are welcome to continue through the stations while the meeting takes place."
- 2. Make one more announcement when the meeting is set to begin.
- 3. Share the meeting agenda.
- 4. Use the Troop Training Slide Deck to train volunteers for the upcoming Cookie Season.
- 5. Showcase the Troop Guide and Troop Materials that all Cookie Volunteers will be receiving.
- 6. Review the Family Guide.
- 7. Ensure Cookie Volunteers complete the Troop Agreement Form to participate in the Cookie Program.

GO EXTRA OPTION!

Black-footed ferrets also love to tunnel. Using 20-30 large boxes, scissors and duct tape- allow girls to work together to build a GIANT cardboard box fort!

MEET THE MASCOT

Girls learn about this year's mascot, the black footed ferret, while completing a fun scavenger hunt.

ACTIVITY: Fiona's Foraging Scavenger Hunt

Black-footed ferrets LOVE to forage! Girl Scouts are given a scavenger hunt sheet with pictures of each variety of cookies.

They must then go around the room "foraging" for the packages that match the cookie.

BEFORE THE EVENT:

Cut out scavenger hunt cards and pictures. Tape up pictures around the room.

SUGGESTED HELPERS:

One Volunteer or Cadette/ Senior/Ambassador Girl Scout

HELPER SCRIPT & INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Provide each Girl Scout with a scavenger hunt card and writing utensil.
- 2. Say: "Are you ready to learn some fun facts about our mascot? Our mascot, Fiona the ferret, loves to forage."

Foraging is when you go into nature to look for food.

At this station you'll help Fiona forage for cookies to put into her Girl Scout Cookie boxes.

Around the room are pictures of Girl Scout Cookies. Each picture includes a FUN fact about black-footed ferrets. When you find them, cross them out on your card.

After you find them all, come back to show me and return your pencil!"





The black-footed ferret is the only ferret species native to North America.



A black-footed ferret has an average lifespan in the wild of 1-3 years and 4-6 in captivity.



Black-footed ferrets are nocturnal (most active at night), and fossorial (live underground).



Black-footed ferrets are dependent on prairie dog colony health, as they are their primary source of food!



The black-footed ferret's habitat is the grassland ecosystem in the North American plains.



Black footed ferrets were thought to be extinct until 1981 when a few were found in Wyoming. Today over 400 live in the wild thanks to captive breeding, reintroduction, and cloning.



Black-footed ferrets are flexible, love to wrestle and play chase. They are also excellent climbers.



Black-footed ferrets are known for their squeaks, hisses and chatter. They also use dance to communicate.

GO EXTRA OPTION!

Teach your Girl Scouts about writing a letter! Place a poster board, chalkboard, or dry erase board in the space.

Explain to girls that you will be working together to write a letter to a business asking them to purchase Cookies for their office.

Have a volunteer guide girls one at a time to add a sentence to the letter until it's done.



ACTIVITY: Cookie Fortune Teller

Girls will get the chance to practice their sales pitch as well as talk to customers with this activity.

Each Girl Scout will fill out the sales pitch worksheet, cut and fold their Cookie Fortune Teller, then practice using both with another Girl Scout or an adult.

BEFORE THE EVENT:

Place out supplies and instruction sheets

SUGGESTED HELPERS:

One Volunteer or Cadette/ Senior/Ambassador Girl Scout

HELPER SCRIPT & INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Put instruction sheets in the center of the table where they are easily accessed.
- 2. Provide each Girl Scout with a Girl Scout Cookie Sales Pitch worksheet.
- 2. Say: "It's important to listen to your customers so you can recommend a cookie they might like. We're going to practice this here.

First, fill in the blanks at the top of the page to write your Girl Scout Cookie Sales Pitch.



GO EXTRA OPTION!

Have the girls make a goal time capsule.

Provide envelopes, notecards, and markers/pencils. Then, encourage the Girl Scouts to write a motivational message to their "future selves" to encourage them to reach their goals.

Girls should seal the envelope and write "Do not open until March 1st" on the front.

ACTIVITY: Vision Board

A vision board is a collage of images, words, and symbols that visually represent a person's goals. They are known to help people achieve their goals by providing inspiration and improving focus on that goal.

For this activity, girls will use the provided supplies alongside their Recognition Flyer to create a vision board of their 2026 Girl Scout Cookie goals!

BEFORE THE EVENT:

Pre-cut some themed items to make it faster for girls to assemble.

SUGGESTED HELPERS:

One -Two Volunteers or Cadette/ Senior/Ambassador Girl Scouts

HELPER SCRIPT & INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Place the included materials as well as a copy of the recognition flyer and other craft supplies on the table for Girl Scouts to use.
- 2. Say: "Setting a goal is the first step to achieving it. But did you know that keeping that goal where you can see it makes it even more likely you'll achieve it?

Today you're going to make a vision board. This is a collage that includes pictures of your cookie goals and other things to help you reach that goal. Things like encouraging words, to do lists, or pictures of the recognition you want the most.

First, fill out your goal chart. Once that's done, grab a piece of construction paper and use the supplies to put it all together!"



GO EXTRA OPTION!

Make the puzzles more interactive by putting evidence around the room to find or by giving the girls a black light then hiding the evidence in boxes labeled with glow in the dark marker.

ACTIVITY: Cookie Booth Money Mystery

Fiona the ferret has a problem and need Girl Scouts to help solve it. Girls are given a worksheet with puzzles to solve using the clues provided and their cookie know-how!

Hints are provided to help younger girls along. Helpers for this booth will have an answer sheet they can utilize.

BEFORE THE EVENT:

Cut out clues. Label each envelope with an Evidence Label. Place the Elf Money in the ziploc bag, then each evidence in their corresponding envelope. Place on the table with calculators. Helpers should be instructed to "reset" between groups.

SUGGESTED HELPERS:

Two Volunteers or Cadette/ Senior/Ambassador Girl Scouts

HELPER SCRIPT & INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Provide each group with one (1) Cookie Booth Money Mystery Worksheet. They will use this as a team.
- 2. Say: "Welcome to the Cookie Booth Money Mystery! Fiona the ferret is glad you're here to help her fix the problems with their cookie inventory and money.

Working as a group, use your cookie knowledge to solve the puzzles on your sheet. You can use any of the clues on the table before you. The worksheet will let you know where to find a hint, if available, but also feel free to ask me for any help you need.

The puzzles must be solved in order.

Please only write on your team worksheet."





Help your Fiona solve the Cookie Booth Money Mystery!

Fiona and her BFF's just finished their very first cookie booth, but something's just not adding up. Solve the puzzles below using the "clues" on the table to help her troop balance their cookie booth sales and save their troop proceeds!

Puzzle #1

The first step in finding a cookie booth error is to double check your package inventory! Open Envelope 111. Inside you'll find a picture of the troop's "Ending Inventory."

Count the number packages in each variety and write it down in the row marked "Ending Inventory" (make sure you put each number under the correct cookie).

Then, use the calculator to total each column and row to find the "Total Packages Sold." Fiona has done Adventurfuls for you as an example!

Part of preparing for a booth is figuring out how many cookies of each variety to bring.

Troop Leaders often use a tool called the "Booth Calculator" on gswny.org to figure this out. The calculator provides an estimate of how many cookies you should bring based off how popular varieties are in Western New York.

You helped Fiona and her troop sort out their cookie booth. Remember! Return all clues and this answer sheet to their envelopes for the next group of cookie sleuths.





DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

Who does all this math at the cookie booth?

Your troop leader will oversee and perform double checks of the cash box and cookie inventory at your cookie booth. As Girl Scouts build their money management skills, they will be able to help more and more with money & inventory. Just like in business, the troop leaders should always perform a double check.

What would the troop have done if they were over or short money?

If a troop is over money, usually it is because they took a troop donation at the booth (for example a customer said to "keep the change") or it is because they had a customer pay by cash for their Cookie Share cookies but the troop did not take them out of their inventory to donate.





ACTIVITY: Cookie 20 Questions

As girls sample their cookies, have them pair off. Each girl takes turns thinking of a cookie variety while their partner asks yes/no questions to try and figure out which cookie they thought of.

BEFORE THE EVENT:

Review proper food handling with volunteers.

Display the cookie varieties and allergen flyers.

If you are low on cookie quantity, consider having your helpers cut them in quarters or halves so each girl can have a taste.

SUGGESTED HELPERS:

Two + Volunteers or Cadette/ Senior/Ambassador Girl Scouts

HELPER SCRIPT & INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Provide each girl with a sample of at least one Girl Scout Cookie.
- 2. While girls are seated and sampling say: "Ok, while we try these cookies, we're going to play a quick game. Pair off with the person on your right.

Your going to take turns. One person from each team, think of a cookie variety but DON'T tell your partner.

Now, your partner is going to ask you yes or no questions about the cookie so they can try to guess what it is. You answer only yes or no. If they haven't guessed correctly by 20 questions their turn is up. Switch roles and now you ask them 20 questions. about the cookie they're thinking of.

An example question might be: "Is your cookie chocolaty? Is your cookie a sandwich? Is your cookie round?"
